



SYNCRONYS for a limited time has funding to support your interface, through funding to the New Mexico Human Services Department from the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare Services to implement, enhance and build the next generation HIE.

With this funding SYNCRONYS has embarked on an unprecedented collaboration with Collective Medical, Orion Health and Rhodes Group (a subsidiary of TriCore Reference Laboratories) to design a state-of-the-art health information exchange system for the good of health care providers and patients throughout New Mexico.

The intent is to exchange as much of the **US Core Data for Interoperability (USCDI)** data set as possible, to enhance the data available to SYNCRONYS HIE users. The ability to exchange the data in the USCDI will be required in 2021 of your certified EHR vendors.

**SYNCRONYS recognizes that not all EHR vendors are ready to send USCDI and we will adjust to take advantage of the funding available now.**

In this case the preference would be:

- An ADT HL v2.5 or later (see attached Orion specs for ADTs and ORUs) and an episodic CCDA (the CCDA is generated for each encounter and only contains data for that encounter). The CCDA should include as much of the USCDI as possible. If the CCDA does not include notes, they can be exchanged via XDS document exchange.

**OR**

- An ADT HL v2.5 or later and a CCDA for a specific time period (the CCDA is generated for all data in the defined time period (i.e. 90 days). The CCDA should include as much of the USCDI as possible. If the CCDA does not include notes, they can be exchanged via XDS document exchange.

**OR**

- A combination of an ADT and other HL7 v2.5 or later messages (ORUs, MDMs, etc) that provide as much of the USCDI as possible

**OR**

- FHIR v4 exchange of as much of the USCDI content as possible.

SYNCRONYS will work with you to integrate our services into your clinical workflow.
